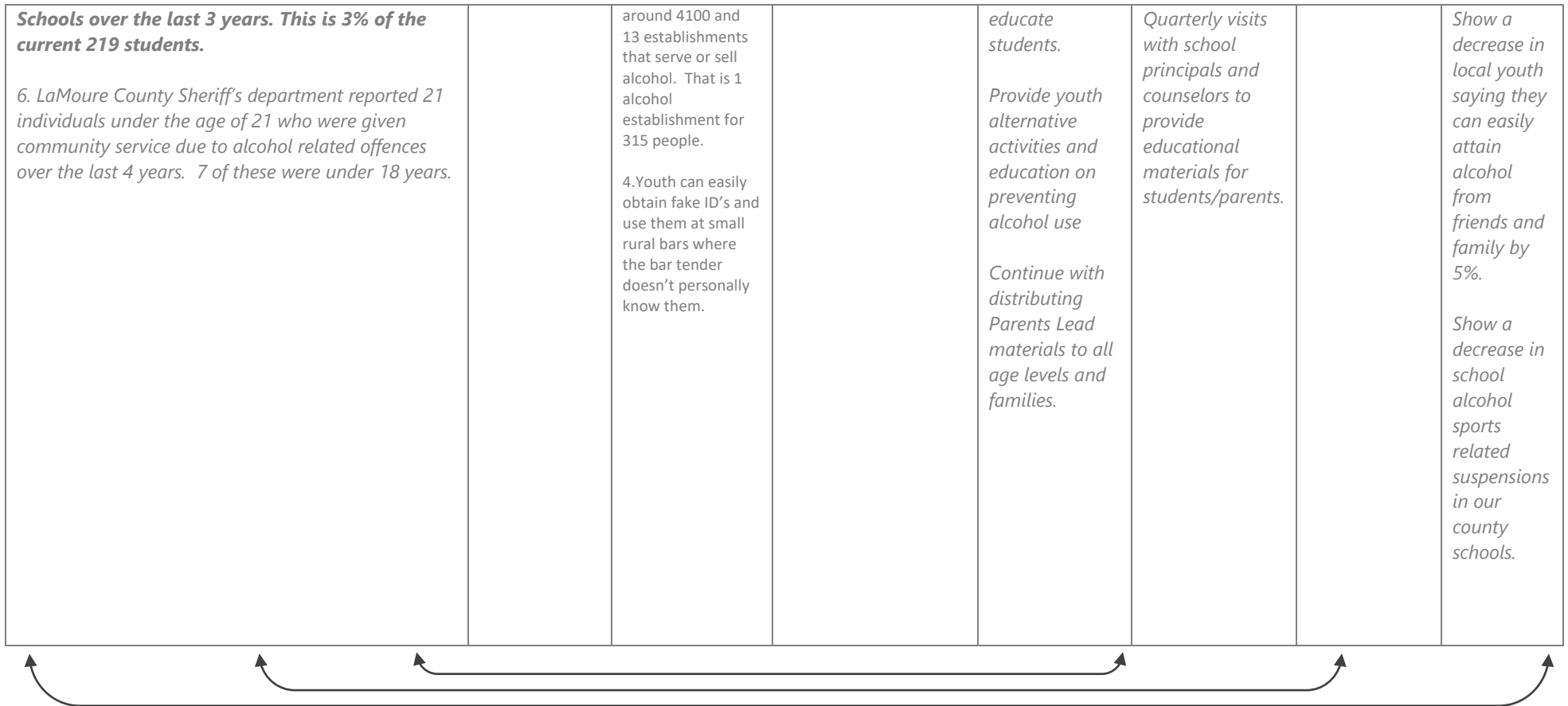

<p>What is the problem or issue in your community?</p> <p>Underage Alcohol Consumption is a problem in LaMoure County.</p> <p>1. Data: 2021 YRBS regional data shows that 8.9% of student b4 age 13 have consumed alcohol and 20.9% have consumed 5 or more alcoholic beverages at a time and only 26.6% of high school students think that binge drinking is harmful.</p> <p>2. From 2017 to 2020, the number of liquor law violations decreased among those 18 to 24 years old. Among those aged 17 and younger, the number of violations slightly increased from 2019 to 2020. For those 25 and older, a substantial increase occurred over the same time period (State of North Dakota Office of Attorney General: ND Epidemiological Profile JANUARY 2022 Compiled and Developed by: The North Dakota State Epidemiological Outcomes Workgroup.</p> <p>3. In the last 4 years there have been 20 DUI citations in LaMoure county. This does not break down by age. ND Highway Patrol.</p> <p>5. There have been 7 alcohol related sports activity suspensions across 4 LaMoure County</p>	<p>Why is it a problem in your community?</p> <p>High Social Availability of alcohol for youth.</p>	<p>What does the problem specifically look like in your community? What is the behavior?</p> <p>1. According to our community survey – 74% of youth can easily obtain alcohol from friends and family, 45% steal from unsecured alcohol at home, 48% obtain from older siblings.</p> <p>2. According to the 2023 community survey of LaMoure County residents – consume alcohol at area lake – 92.6%, 63% at shop parties, 59% driving around.</p> <p>3. LaMoure County has a population</p>	<p>What environmental change can you implement to impact your identified problem?</p> <p>Work with LaMoure County alcohol establishments to encourage policy for beverage server training to all employees.</p> <p>Work on ID Scanner policy with liquor establishments in the county.</p>	<p>What are all the steps that must happen to implement the environmental change?</p> <p>Educate and encourage Beverage Server Training Policy at each alcohol establishment.</p> <p>ID Scanner education for each establishment and how to use.</p> <p>Partner with school counselors and church youth groups to</p>	<p>Measures the local condition – what are you doing to address the problem?</p> <p>Track number of meetings with county establishments to educate on Server Training and keep track of trainings held.</p> <p>Implement regular visits to establishments that have Fake ID Scanners to gather data, educate, and keep the scanners updated.</p>	<p>Measures the intervening variable – what you are doing to reduce access?</p> <p>“How do we know it’s working”</p> <p>LCPH will keep track of local server trainings held and number of people trained.</p> <p>LCPH will track the number of establishments that will utilize the Fake ID scanners the next 2-3 years.</p>	<p>Measures the impact to the problem – are you seeing long-term behavior change?</p> <p>Decrease in YRBS percentages by 3-5% in youth that can easily obtain alcohol from friends and family, steal from home, or obtain from older siblings.</p>
