

### SUBSTANCE USE PREVENTION (SUPTRS) BLOCK GRANT

ORGANIZATION NAME: LaMoure County Public Health Department

1. Provide a narrative of the problem.

Youth drinking in LaMoure County has become a social norm in this area. We will work diligently to provide our community with education and resources to decrease numbers to reflect on reducing the number in our problem statement below.

#### **Strategic Plan Outline**

Problem Statement: Underage Alcohol Consumption is a problem in LaMoure County.

- Data: 2021 YRBS regional data shows that 8.9% of students before age 13 have consumed alcohol and 20.9% have consumed 5 or more alcoholic beverages at a time and only 26.6% of high school students think that binge drinking is harmful.
- From 2017 to 2020, the number of liquor law violations decreased among those 18 to 24 years old. Among those aged 17 and younger, the number of violations slightly increased from 2019 to 2020. For those 25 and older, a substantial increase occurred over the same time period. (State of North Dakota Office of Attorney General: ND Epidemiological Profile JANUARY 2022 Compiled and Developed by the North Dakota State Epidemiological Outcomes Workgroup.
- In 2019, ND gave 23 DUI citations to individuals under 21. National Drunk Driving Statistics Map Responsibility.org.
- In the last 4 years, there have been 20 DUI citations in LaMoure County. This does not break down by age. (ND Highway Patrol)
- There have been 7 alcohol related sports activity suspensions across 4 LaMoure County Schools over the last 3 years. This is 3% of the current 219 students.
- LaMoure County Sheriff's department reported 21 individuals under the age of 21 who were given community service due to alcohol related offences over the last 4 years. 7 of these were under 18 years of age.

**Objective 1:** Reduce alcohol use by young adults aged 18-20

Strategy 1: Provide opportunities to educate the community on the dangers of binge drinking.

**Strategy 2:** Alcohol Establishments adopt policies that require servers to participate in Responsible Server Training within 3 months of employment.

<u>Activity 1- Information Dissemination</u>: Host booths at community events with the goal of passing out information on binge drinking, hang up posters/Billboard ads in high traffic areas in the community, run radio messaging. Meet and share information with key stakeholders.

# Strategy 1: Alcohol retailers adopt policies on mandatory fake ID training and use of forensic scanners.

<u>Activity 1- Information Dissemination</u>: Meet and share information with key stakeholders, presentation to groups, handout flyers to different locations educating on the importance of checking ID and confiscating fake IDs obtained.

<u>Activity 2- Enhance Skills</u>: Host community training and education on forensic scanners to be utilized at community events where alcohol is served and at local alcohol establishments and retailers.

Installation of security cameras to high crime areas in our community (One in each LaMoure County Community) to act as a deterrent or increase enforcement of alcohol- free areas.
