

Supervised Independent Living:

- Voluntary program available only to North Dakota youth in foster care.
- Assists youth to achieve their goals by providing services and resources to help effectively and smoothly transition into adulthood with a sense of normalcy.
- Offers housing to eligible youth, which may be an individual or shared apartment or living space.
- Provides case management services, transportation assistance, financial assistance, educational support, independent living opportunities such as grocery shopping, money management, budgeting, and career preparation.
- Governed by NDCC 50-11 and NDAC 75-03-41.
 Currently, offered by one agency, Nexus PATH Family Healing statewide.

Supervised Independent Living (SIL) Program

SIL Program Eligibility:

- Youth ages 18 to 21 currently under the custody of a Human Services Zone, Tribal Social Services or the Division of Juvenile Services (DJS).
- Youth currently in the placement and care of a Human Services Zone or Tribal Social Services actively participating in 18+ Continued foster care services with a signed 18+ Continued Foster Care Agreement.
- 18+ Continued Care participate must participate in one
 of the following categories education, employment,
 employment preparatory program or have a medical
 condition or disability that prevents achieving one of the
 other categories.
- Youth can remain in 18+ foster care or return to 18+ foster care at a later date, if applicable. Children and Family Services allows youth to contact their previous custodial agency to assist them in returning to care if desired.
