SPECIMEN LABELING/REJECTION POLICY

All clinical primary specimen containers must have a patient name, along with a second unique identifier, such as date of birth, medical record number, or accession number.

Appropriate laboratory orders must accompany each specimen and must contain the following information:

- 1. Patient name (Last, First Name)
 - a. Anonymous testing will not be performed.
 - b. Specimens labeled with obvious pseudo-names will not be accepted.
- 2. Date of birth
- 3. Health care provider
- 4. Submitting institution name and address
- 5. Identification code
- 6. Type of specimen
- 7. Test requested
- 8. Date of collection

Criteria for specimen rejection:

- 1. Recommended transport/hold time exceeded
- 2. Specimen damaged (ex: leaked or broken)
- 3. Improper specimen (ex: contaminated, inadequate collection, wrong body site or duplicate sample)
- 4. Unsuitable for request
- 5. Specimens of insufficient amount (QNS)
- 6. Unlabeled or mislabeled specimens
