

Available Regardless of Insurance Status and/or at a Reduced or No Cost

HEALTH CARE:

Federally Qualified Health Centers:

- Provide primary care and preventative care (including physical health, oral health and mental health/substance use services) regardless of ability to pay or health insurance status.

Family Planning Clinics:

- Offer services for men and women including contraceptive services, sexually transmitted infection testing, medical exams and more.

Local Public Health Units:

 Provide immunizations, blood pressure screening, diabetes screenings, tobacco and substance abuse prevention services and more. Visit <u>hhs.nd.gov/service-locations/local-public-health</u> for clinic locations and information on services offered.

Indian Health Service (IHS):

- Provide covered health care services to eligible American Indian/Alaska Native individuals. There is some type of health care program/facility on each reservation. They are not all IHS.

- *If you seek care from a hospital emergency room not on the reservation and are enrolled in a tribal nation, it is a good idea to contact your local tribal health facility within 48 hours. Procedures to request coverage of costs varies.

Pregnancy and Parenting:

SCREENINGS/DISEASE MANAGEMENT:

Colorectal Cancer Screening Program:

Community Health Representatives (CHR) Program:

- Provides transportation to medical appointments, home visits to check blood pressure, blood sugar, pulse, oxygen; medication pickup and delivery; and health promotion. Visit <u>ihs.gov/chr/</u>

Pharmacies:

• Services vary but may include blood pressure tests, immunizations and prediabetes and blood sugar testing.

North Dakota Community Clinical Collaborative:

HIV Care/Ryan White Program:

Regional Behavioral Health Clinics (Human Service Centers):
