



ELIGIBILITY

Districts should apply if they are interested in planning and implementing a **Kindergarten Transition** Program that meets the guidelines of the grant

\$10,000 One-time award for planning and implementation with payment upon completion and review of the district's unique Kindergarten Transition Plan

*The Transition Plan will be written with guidance through the grant's Learning Community and Consultant



Technical Assistance



Technical assistance will be provided by the Early Childhood Section to support the development and implementation of each district's unique, comprehensive kindergarten transition program plan.

Awardees will participate in the virtual ND Kindergarten Transition Community of Learners and eceive three individual virtual consultation meetings to assist in developing the key component areas of a well-designed kindergarten transition plan.



Learning Community



PAYMENT OF GRANT AWARD



Awardees will utilize North Dakota's Comprehensive Kindergarten Transition Plan Guide as a framework to develop and submit their kindergarten transition program plan. Upon review, program's will be awarded grant funds.

Plans will include:

- a research-based framework
- a minimum of four family-child engagement sessions
- opportunities for both the child and the adult(s) to kindergarten environments and activities for success
- sessions for adult education





IMPLEMENTATION



Each district's format and implementation timeline will be unique to their Kindergarten Transition Program Plan.

Awardees will be required to implement at least one round of their Kindergarten Transition Program by June 1, **2026**.


Do we have to implement the plan this spring?
