




WHAT TYPE OF HOUSING DO YOU LIVE IN TODAY?




How long have you lived in North Dakota?




How many people under 18 years-old currently live in your household?


Age distribution of survey Respondents



























For housing to be considered affordable to you, it should not take up more than 30% of your gross (before tax) household income. What do you pay for housing today? (monthly costs)



Average of Percentage of Income on Housing


What percentage of your total household income does your housing cost currently represent?


