What is a Client Share (Recipient Liability)

Some members may qualify for ND Medicaid benefits at no cost while others may have to pay a portion of their medical bills. This is called Client Share (Recipient Liability). Applying a client share to a member's coverage is based on the difference between a household's monthly net income (after deductions) and Medicaid's income limits. The client share works like a deductible. Each month, ND Medicaid requires the member to pay their own medical bills until they have met their set client share amount. Then, ND Medicaid pays for the remaining medical bills until the new month starts and the process starts over.

Setting the Amount for Client Share

The total countable income minus any allowable deductions.	Remainder – Income Limits		
	That remainder is then subtracted from Medicaid's income limits.	= Client Share	
		The remaining amount equals the client share.	

Common deductions used to lower a member's monthly client share are: Medicaid income limits are based Members must submit proof of -Health insurance premiums and copays for on household size from the expenses to use them as Medicare and/or private health insurance household's gross countable deductions. Proof is sent to the income (income before Customer Support Center or a -Payroll taxes (FICA, state tax and Medicare human service zone office. deduction) deductions). -Childcare expenses.

Informing the Member of their Client Share

When the member is responsible to pay a medical bill, to meet their client share, ND Medicaid sends a notice to the member with the provider's name and the cost and date of the services. The member is responsible for paying the client share to the provider(s) listed on the notice.


Applying the Client Share

- A member's client share may be applied to bills from more than one medical provider.
- Medicaid is the payor of last resort. This means that medical providers must bill all other health insurance policies a
 member has before billing ND Medicaid. Members will need to inform ND Medicaid through the Customer Support Center
 or a human service zone office and their medical providers of all health insurance policies they have.

Balancing the Client Share

Changes to income, deductions, or Medicaid's income limits could cause a member's client share amount to be lowered for current or previous months. This could cause a member to make more payments to their medical bills than needed. When this happens, North Dakota Health and Human Services will review your claims. The department will pay the provider and tell the provider to repay you. Neither you nor the provider should have to do anything.
